2 (Following recitation of the Pledge of
3 Allegiance, the meeting was called to order.)

4 MAYOR MCGINTY: Ladies and gentlemen,
5 I just left Assemblywoman Miller. As you
6 recall, last year she provided us with the
7 opportunity for a grant in the amount of twenty
8 thousand dollars, which we are in the process of
9 utilizing for the northern end of Long Beach
10 Road up around the senior citizen housing.

11 Tonight she gave the Village an
12 opportunity to compete for a twenty-five
13 thousand dollar grant which we will be able to
14 piggyback on top of this one. We ought to be
15 very thankful to Assemblywoman Miller for her
16 efforts on our behalf.

17 Madam Clerk, the roll, please.

18 MS. CONROY: Trustee Michael
19 Gagliardi.

20 TRUSTEE GAGLIARDI: Present.

21 MS. CONROY: Trustee Barbara
22 Volpe-Ried.

23 TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: Present.

24 MS. CONROY: Trustee Irene Naudus.

25 MAYOR MCGINTY: Excused, please.

2 MS. CONROY: Trustee Joseph Annarella.

3 TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: Present.

4 MS. CONROY: Village Attorney Susan
5 Boland.

7 MAYOR MCGINTY: She is excused, I
8 believe.

9 MS. CONROY: That is correct, Mayor.
10 And Mayor Michael McGinty.

11 MAYOR MCGINTY: Yes. Trustee
12 Annarella is also the appointed Deputy Mayor.
13 One correction, Madam Clerk.

14 Madam Clerk, shall we start with the
15 reports?

16 MS. CONROY: Yes. Public Safety,
17 please.

18 TRUSTEE GAGLIARDI: Good evening all.
19 For the Island Park Fire Department, ninety
20 alarms. Signal nine rescues, fifty-six. Second
21 signal nines, three. General alarms, fourteen.
22 Still alarms, two. Extrication, one. One water
23 rescue. Six ambulance mutual aids. One fire
24 mutual aid. One water rescue. Two general
25 assemblies, for a grand total of ninety calls.

2 The 4th Precinct's report: Six
3 arrests made in Island Park. Twenty parking
4 violations. Four movers. Thirty-seven aided
5 cases. That's is my report.

6 MAYOR McGINTY: Thank you, Trustee
7 Gagliardi.

8 TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: Hi, everyone. I
9 would like to thank all the residents for such a
10 great start to the summer season. We have had a
11 wonderful turnout for our movie and concert
12 series. All scheduled events can be found on
13 our website as well as the Village Hall and
14 beach.

15 This summer, one of our concerts,
16 which will take place on Sunday August 12th, two
17 o'clock p.m., will serve as a fundraiser event
18 for the United States veterans. We are excitted
19 to work with Paul Ferguson Yes, We Care
20 organization for such an important cause. We
21 invite all past and present families of
22 servicemen and women to join us on Masone Beach.
23 It's a day to give thanks, show respect and
24 honor all members of the United States Military
25 Service.

7 TRUSTEE GAGLIARDI: Month of July, two
8 hundred thirty-five curb violations. Thirty
9 expired meter. Thirteen backed into stall. Two
10 handicapped parking. No commuter parking, five.
11 No parking permit, twenty-six. Blocked hydrant,
12 two. Alternate street parking, fifty-five.
13 Parked in the road, one. Restricted parking,
14 forty-one. Out of stall, four. Bus stop,
15 three. Traveling in portion of road, one.
16 Non-distinct plate, two. Right to curb, two.
17 Blocked driveway, one. Twelve inches from curb,
18 three. Inspections, twenty-two and expired
19 registrations, thirteen for a total of two
20 thirty-five.

21 TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: Public Works
22 report. The following was collected in June:
23 Two hundred seventy-three point fifteen tons
24 municipal solid waste. Ten point seventy-eight
25 tons of mixed glass. All street light and

2 meters reported not working are being repaired.
3 All Village owned property is being maintained
4 by DPW with the assistance of our wonderful
5 beach staff. That is our report.

6 MAYOR MCGINTY: J.J., I had asked you
7 at some point in the summer, with the
8 forbearance of Trustee Volpe-Ried, do you mind
9 if I talk about this?

10 TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: I don't know what
11 you are talking about.

12 MAYOR MCGINTY: The beautification --

13 TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: You can do it.

14 MAYOR MCGINTY: J.J. has been taking
15 our young people around on beautification
16 projects. It's a joint effort for everyone on
17 the beach. All the young people go out and do
18 it with a smile on their face and song in their
19 hearts. They do a fabulous job. A couple of
20 husbands are annoyed with us saying if those
21 kids can weed, why can't you. It's going well
22 and I want to thank you for your service.

23 You were talking about building
24 permits earlier. You reminded me, EmPower Solar
25 last Friday celebrated their two thousandth

2 installation of solar panels and their one
3 hundredth installation of a solar generator
4 across the Village of Island Park. We are
5 averaging two solar installations a month. Two
6 a month. Couple that with we have a hundred
7 seventy-five homes on monolithic foundations.

8 Well, bluntly, the Renaissance
9 continues. So, also, August 3rd -- trustee
10 Volpe-Ried, why don't you say something?

11 TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: Shabbat Shalom on
12 Masone Beach, eight o'clock on Masone Beach, and
13 there are fliers up here.

14 MAYOR MCGINTY: Trustee Gagliardi, why
15 don't you mention about the Rabbi. He's our
16 chaplain now.

17 TRUSTEE GAGLIARDI: I haven't met him
18 yet.

19 MAYOR MCGINTY: For obvious reasons I
20 caught him up at South Nassau making the rounds.
21 He was doing hospital visits. Quite a guy.

22 So, HNGP, our hazard mitigation grant
23 project. We are at the point now where we
24 prepared, with the great assistance of Walden
25 Environmental, we have prepared budget estimates

2 for Phase 2 and Phase 3. Homeland Security and
3 the consortium DSHES. The consortium of state
4 and federal agencies working on this project
5 with us, they were reviewing the budget as we
6 speak. You should know about the culmination of
7 those discussions shortly.

8 We are replacing fuel tanks at the DPW
9 garage. There are two cogent points that we
10 need to remember. The first, contamination, de
11 minimis -- never mind de minimis -- there was no
12 soil contamination.

13 Secondly, we agreed to an
14 intermunicipal agreement with the Town of
15 Hempstead. We will be using their fuel depot in
16 a couple of days.

17 MS. CONROY: Maybe as soon as
18 tomorrow.

19 MAYOR MCGINTY: Madam Clerk has been
20 working assiduously to get that working. Time
21 and labor and fiscal are the important points.
22 Time and labor; the fuel depot is right near the
23 old garbage dump. Efficient because the men can
24 fill up on their way back or on their way to
25 disposal.

2 Secondly, we will end up paying
3 wholesale. You have seen some garbage trucks
4 from another district at the pumps on Austin
5 Boulevard. You won't see ours there. We have
6 been able to do the fiscally responsible thing.

7 I might note that Deputy Mayor Trustee
8 Annarella doesn't say anything, but he's the
9 impetus behind our ability to go to Merrick on a
10 regular basis, so you guys should know how hard
11 he works. He will never tell you.

12 We are working on our passive pocket
13 park. Nothing new to report. We will be
14 putting up a police substation and gazebo.
15 Emergency management operations at the Island
16 Park Fire Department continue and right now we
17 are in the design stage for not only the
18 resiliency and hardening on the second floor,
19 but also the drive flood proofing around the
20 perimeter of the building. That dry flood
21 proofing will be completed under the direct
22 supervision of FEMA. We will continue with
23 shared services.

24 We are entering into an intermunicipal
25 agreement with the Village of Valley Stream for

2 the fabrication of traffic signs. The Village
3 pays quite a bit for traffic signs but not
4 enough to warrant our own sign shop. I had
5 occasion to meet with the Mayor of Valley Stream
6 recently. He's able to provide fabricate and
7 provide signs to us at a far better price than
8 we are be able to do it ourselves through
9 outsourcing.

10 I mentioned Assemblywoman Miller and
11 the grants on the Little Beach. Trustee
12 Volpe-Ried and our DPW Supervisor, Bill Boyce,
13 came up with an idea over by the splash park at
14 Masone Beach. The sea grass was overgrown.
15 They decided to move it and transplant it on the
16 Little Beach. Well, I was there yesterday and
17 it looks wonderful. That sea grass is one of
18 the initial steps to prevention, to further
19 prevention of erosion on that Little Beach. So
20 you should know about that.

21 We are continuing to address parking
22 issues. We opened up many discussions with our
23 insurance carrier. We are able to open up the
24 parking lot where the present village hall sits
25 for commercial and resident use. Now please,

2 you can't ingress or egress off Long Beach Road;
3 you have to come around the block. Those
4 represent liability issues and I'm sure you
5 understand.

6 I think that is it, ladies and
7 gentlemen. That is all I have to report. Oh,
8 you're right, there is one other thing. PSE&G
9 has two types of lines, transmission and
10 distribution. Transmission lines have all been
11 redone throughout the perimeter of the Village
12 of Island Park as part of a pilot project.
13 They're going to do the same with the
14 distribution lines, which are over here in this
15 general vicinity, and they're going to do that
16 after Labor Day.

17 It's a heavier line and frankly, with
18 a pilot project they spend a lot more time down
19 here making sure we don't lose electricity, and
20 when there are problems, they find the solution
21 right away, and frankly, it makes it easier for
22 them to expand those projects into other
23 communities.

24 I think that is all I have to report.

25 TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: One second.

8 falls asleep. I got a kick out of it.

9 Madam Clerk, can we move on with the

19 them. That is the task we ascribe to you.

20 MS. ROTHMAN: A little more
21 information as we get closer.

22 MAYOR MCGINTY: I will. You have a
23 question or comment.

24 MS. ROTHMAN: I have been entrusted
25 with a key to the bulletin board in the station

3 MAYOR MCGINTY: Of course you have.

4 MS. ROTHMAN: I would like to give one
5 to the Village so they can they can post the

10 Village Hall because I'm working, so I have a
11 problem because I get home after six o'clock.
12 I'm also going to work with the library to get

17 You said you are replacing the storage tank;

23 sanitation districts their trucks pull up at the
24 retail markets. We are not pulling up to the
25 retail markets.

3 MAYOR McGINTY: Yes.

4 MS. ROTHMAN: We will get an equal or
5 better price once the tanks are installed.

6 MAYOR McGINTY: Yes, they are going to
7 be below ground. There double walled, steel

8 tanks. There is some sort of flood proofing
9 involved. I'm not that technical.

10 MS. ROTHMAN: The other question is
11 what is the status on sidewalk dining for the
12 restaurants.

13 MAYOR McGINTY: They're not
14 interested. Jack's Pizza was the impetus. Once
15 we helped them expedite the expansion of their
16 store, they found out that was better for them.
17 One of the reasons that we expedited opening the
18 parking lot here so that Jack's could expand
19 their kitchen and La Caramba, which is coming in
20 the old Island Park Deli, would have sufficient
21 parking. Eddie Salavar of La Caramba said he's
22 not interested in outside dining and DaVinci's
23 said it's a headache and they're not interested.

24 MS. ROTHMAN: That is not what I
25 heard. I heard they're not getting cooperation

2 from the Village. I spoke to Christina.

3 MAYOR McGINTY: I saw Christina as
4 recently as this afternoon. I can't cooperate

9 glad to.


