- 1 6/18/20 Board of Trustees meeting 2 Family health/dental insurance 3 coverage will be paid for all full time 4 non-exempt and exempt employees at the rate of 5 one hundred percent for all current employees 6 hired prior to the date of this employee 7 handbook's adoption, including all increases in 8 premium payments for the plan now in effect. 9 Premium cost for individual and family health/dental coverage will be paid for all 10 11 full time non-exempt and exempt employees at the 12 rate of eighty-five percent for all employees 13 hired after the date of this employee handbook's 14 adoption, including all increases in premium 15 payments for the plan now in effect. Each newly 16 hired employee will contribute fifteen percent 17 towards their health/dental insurance benefits. 18 Insurance buy-out provision will be 19 offered at the level of family, thousand five 20 hundred, and single, one thousand two hundred to 21 all full-time employees who do not enroll in the 22 medical insurance coverage provided by the Village. 23 2.4 MAYOR McGINTY:


