Annarella.
TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: Present.
MS. CONROY: Village Attorney Susan
Boland.
MAYOR McGINTY: Excused.
TRUSTEE NAUDUS: We just got a test
mesage. She's at the hospital. Her husband was just taken by amulance.

MS. CONROY: Mayor Michael McGinty.
MAYOR McGINTY: Yes, ma'am.
MAYOR McGINTY: Madam clerk were are

you ready to go.
MS. CONROY: Public hearing for the tentative impact and local government exemption impact report. A copy of the tentative budget and exemption impact report is available for public inspection all interested persons will be given an opportunities to give oral and/or written comments on the 2021-2022 tentative budget.

MAYOR McGINTY: Motion to open the hearing?

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I'll make it.
MAYOR McGINTY: Second.
TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: Second.
MAYOR MCGINTY: All in favor of
opening the hearing? Do you want to ask any questions of me on the record?

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: No.
MAYOR MCGINTY: Are there any other
interested parties on the Zoom call? Seeing none, I ask for a motion to close the hearing.

TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: So move.
TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Second.
MAYOR McGINTY: On the motion.

(Whereupon, all Board members voted
affirmatively.)
MAYOR McGINTY: Madam Clerk,
Resolution Number 1.
MS. CONROY: Adoption of tentative
budget. Resolved, that the tentative budget for
fiscal year June 1, 2021 to May 31, 2022 as discussed at the budget hearings beginning April 19, 2021 and concluded on May 3, 2021 be and hereby is adopted.

MAYOR MCGINTY: Are there any motions?
(No response by Board members.)
MAYOR MCGINTY: We can make a motion to adopt the budget, we can make a motion to adopt the budget with the proviso that on a regular basis we meet to cut spending and enhance revenues or any mixture there of. We can motion to approve the budget with the proviso that two week look-ahead or one week look-ahead before any spending is permitted. Here we are.

MS. CONROY: Can you explain the two,
please? Time line, what can we do.
MAYOR McGINTY: We can move to -- one

of the things we can do, one of the motions, we can vote to approve the budget with the proviso with a look-ahead, whether it's one week or two week, at your discretion, prior to any spending or accepting any revenues. Both sides, spending and revenues.

We can motion to pass the budget with the proviso that in subsequent Village Board meetings we can vote to cut expenses or deal with personnel or any number of budget related items.

The budget is a living, breathing document. As such, it's subject to amendment throughout the fiscal year.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: If this budget doesn't get accepted, what happens?

MAYOR McGINTY: Well, if the budget is not accepted, we will hear from the State Comptroller; that's a certainty. I would -- I don't know whether you want to hear advice or not, but $I$ would advise you to move on the budget with the proviso that you pick it on a weekly basis, because I think this budget above all needs a weekly follow through on anticipated

5/3/21 Special Board Meeting spending and recognition of revenue, and along those lines, reductions in spending if we find that a revenue item will not be realized.

I think we finally reached that point where we are going to have to be very proactive. Seriously.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Knowing that, that we got all the changes, last changes at four-thirty or five o'clock today in our boxes, I'm not comfortable passing the budget without sitting down with the Board and you, Mayor, and going over everything. We were promised that we were going to do that and it never happened. So many changes.

MAYOR McGINTY: If I might comment, I'll meet any time, anywhere with the four of you.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: At this point I'm not comfortable passing the budget.

MAYOR McGINTY: The five of us should continue to meet.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Well, we do that anyway, Mayor. All the numbers changing, it's overwhelming. We don't understand it. We reach

out to support for people we personally know and at the end of the day to pass this budget, not knowing what actually is in the budget, $I$ will not agree to pass the budget.

MAYOR McGINTY: That's fine.
TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I don't know what everybody else wants to do.

MAYOR McGINTY: Madam Trustee, may I speak? That's fine.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Yeah, I'm not talking.

MAYOR McGINTY: Trustee Naudus, I have no problem with adjourning the meeting. I just want it clear that $I$ have been available to each and every one of you. I hesitate to say $24 / 7$ but pretty much 24/7. As far as the rest, if we adjourn, we should meet in an accelerated fashion, the five of us. We should have, in truth, we should have all our questions and concerns prepared and the five of us should hash it out.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I thought we did it a couple of weeks ago, Mike, and you told us that you would come back with a detailed budget

5/3/21 Special Board Meeting and in detail on every line what we are spending it on.

MAYOR McGINTY: It's here.
TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I know you are doing the best you can, Michael, but we are still on the blind side here.

MAYOR McGINTY: Now that you have the budget in hand I suggest to you you develop more questions.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I don't have the budget right now because it was dropped off at Village Hall. Making changes up to three o'clock in the afternoon when we are having a meeting at six forty-five, how can we come up with questions?

TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: Can we adjourn and then meet?

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: No, you have to pass it tonight or not pass it correct, Mayor?

MAYOR MCGINTY: I think if we adjourn it we keep the budget meeting open. In effect May 3rd remains Groundhog Day.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Connie, is that

MS. CONROY: There is an e mail I
received from Barbara at NYCOM and I believe I forwarded it to all of you.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I believe it said today is the deadline.

MS. CONROY: And there is no options for an extension. I'm reading from her e-mail. If you do not adopt that date, meaning the 3rd, the tentative budget automatically becomes the adopted budget.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Correct.
MS. CONROY: The question is for Barbara Van Epps, which budget is the tentative budget from the various budget hearings that we have held.

TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: That is what I mean, which one is the budget? That means we have no choice.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Exactly. I saw that e-mail. It said --

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: Is it budget number nine?

MAYOR McGINTY: Does it assure that we can meet, hold on, that we can meet

expeditiously and amend the budget going forward on a monthly basis. Does that help you?

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: No, it does not,
Michael. We have no control over this. To say that we would.

MAYOR McGINTY: I don't know how else to respond to you.

TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: We don't really have a choice. We have to adopt one of these budgets, correct?

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: We don't have to adopt anything, do we?

TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: Connie, didn't you say we have to adopt something; otherwise, we go back to the original budget, which is budget number one and Mike cut after that do you all want to go back to budget number one?

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: If I'm not mistaken, if we stay with the budget we have now, we can still do those weekly changes through the year.

MAYOR McGINTY: That's true. We can, by Board resolution, we can make any changes we need to make and frankly, I don't really care what budget we pass. I care about passing the

budget. Make no mistake. But, what I care about is a one week or two week look-ahead. Otherwise -- I think Trustee Annarella said that.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I would rather do
that.
TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: We have budget one, two, three, four, five. Which one are you talking about?

MAYOR McGINTY: I suggest we pass the most recent one which contains -- I outlined the changes.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: We haven't seen number nine yet, Mike.

MAYOR McGINTY: All $I$ can do is assure you is number nine, do you see the tax rate on the shared screen here? That is the big part. It indicates that the $\$ 508.10$ is an immediate -timely interest payment plus --

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: That is not what he said in his e-mail, Michael. What did he mean about the about the tax levy?

MAYOR McGINTY: What happens is we have to prepare a schedule and the earliest tax

liens are paid first. If they are not paid first ultimately, the earliest ones cannot be rolled over in the following note. At some point we would have to pay them.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Do we know what the tax levy was? He said your latest tax levy.

MAYOR McGINTY: Tax liens total five hundred eight thousand and they're relatively evenly spread over the last five years, from memory.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: The question $I$ have is, if we don't pass the budget whatever you produce in budget number nine is that what we have to adopt? That is the one that takes effect, I mean?

MAYOR McGINTY: Yeah. But again I outlined the changes for you. I can show them to you here.
tRUSTEE NAUDUS: I can't see. I'm on my phone.

MAYOR MCGINTY: I'll verbalize. It provides for property tax increase. It provides for, on the debt service, interest payment of six thousand three hundred fifty on the tax lien

of five hundred eight, five hundred eight thousand. With the understanding that we have to have a schedule in place, an inventory of age, aging schedule of tax liens and go from there.

It shows a cut in on the beach of thirty thousand seven fifty. Shows an increase of twenty-three thousand five on zoning because of the Transit Oriented Development. It shows employee benefits are roughly ten percent increase, which we were advised to do. It shows that we have, instead of the thirteen thousand six that goes to HUD, we have put in escrow all the money due HUD and we are waiting on Paul Mills' opinion on that as with to when we pay. It includes two hundred fifty thousand dollars for privatization of garbage. It includes terminal leave payments of about sixty-five thousand dollars to cover, we believe there are going to be at least two retirements this year. There are some odds and ends reductions. There is a reduction in public safety and transportation. Transportation is all the street cleaning maintenance. Why it's

5/3/21 Special Board Meeting called transportation, I have no idea. Trustee Naudus?

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: On one of the budgets you put taxes to be raised three point one one zero dot two five eight. Then the next one I got it went up to three three three nine-o-eight seven. That is five hundred thirty three more. That is a nineteen percent increase from the original. How did you get to that number? Summary budget.

MAYOR McGINTY: It was an error in calculation. Right, I know.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: An error in calculations, I'm not comfortable in passing the budget.

MAYOR McGINTY: You were going to be uncomfortable passing the budget no matter what I said. How do you want me to respond? TRUSTEE NAUDUS: There no need to respond. The numbers are jumping drastically. We don't get it when we see numbers change so drastically.

MAYOR McGINTY: The numbers changed drastically because there was a

5/3/21 Special Board Meeting misinterpretation on how to handle the tax anticipation note of five hundred eight thousand.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I don't believe that was corrected by the e-mail I read today.

MAYOR McGINTY: Okay. I don't know how to respond to that.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I don't know enough information about it, but looking at that e-mail --

MAYOR McGINTY: I can only tell you what bond counsel told me. I can only tell you that we will have an aging schedule of outstanding tax liens and it's an inventory problem. First in, first out.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: If we retain the same budget we have we still have the option to make the cuts on weekly basis, monthly basis, and rearrange the budget for the next year? Right?

MAYOR MCGINTY: The problem is the following: The problem with that is then we are working with last year's tax rate, which is a problem going forward. You can have -- I'm not

trying to be a wise guy. You can have it all by passing this budget and then meeting regularly to a one week look-ahead. No spending until everybody sees.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: You talk about having it all. We don't know what is in it. We don't have it. We haven't seen line for line. These are numbers of a group of pieces of a budget. We don't know what the meat and potatoes are.

MAYOR McGINTY: I don't know how to respond to that except to say you know --

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: I'll give an example. Maybe I'm wrong. We passed the budget last year. And then things came up about raises. And you said well, it was in the budget, we have it to do it. How can we change things monthly if it's in the budget? You have to do it. Which way is it?

MAYOR McGINTY: The way to proceed going forward, first of all, there are no salary increases in the budget.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Stop right there. Because the budget that we are currently in,

they give raises to several people. Can we change that going forward?

MAYOR McGINTY: Yes. No, it's already been done.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I'm saying, if we pass the budget that we are still currently in, like you said, if we pass the budget tonight we can make changes weekly. Why can we not be able to do that if we stayed with the budget we have now?

MAYOR McGINTY: Mainly because of the tax rate. Mainly because of the revenue side of the budget.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I understand that. But can we, like you said, on a weekly to weekly basis change the budget that we are going to currently go with, which is the old budget.

MAYOR McGINTY: We can't increase, once we pass a budget, we cannot increase taxes we cannot increase revenue.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I understand that. But can we change the increases that we had in the current budget that we're working on. If you are saying going forward if we pass we can

change it bi-weekly, whatever, monthly, whatever we think we want to do. Can we do the same thing if we are going with the budget that we already have?

MAYOR McGINTY: No, because --
TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: Because of the taxes, you said.

MAYOR McGINTY: I have two examples: The first is the tax levy. The second is we can go before the Board. The Board can go to reduce expenditures. It cannot go to increase expenditures.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Your biggest concern right now, Mayor, is the taxes, right?

MAYOR McGINTY: That and the --
TRUSTEE NAUDUS: The revenue of the taxes.

MAYOR McGINTY: I'm worried about the revenue on taxes, because whatever happens this year impacts next year and the year after. If you lose a year, you lose a lot of money over the long-term. The second part that I'm concerned about is if we don't pass the current budget and in fact we cannot increase the

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I understand that.
TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: I have a question. I'm trying to read this on my screen real quick. To be raised, two point eight three one compared to two point eight-o-five.

MAYOR McGINTY: Right.
TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: We are looking for a tax increase of twenty-six thousand dollars. Is that what we are fighting over?

MAYOR McGINTY: That is not the number we're fighting over, the twenty-five thousand dollars.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: That is the number I see, though.

MAYOR McGINTY: Listen to me, please. There are two things, the tax increase, two percent this year is a tax increase next year of two percent. There is multiplier effect that we cannot ignore. Two percent becomes four percent next year and so forth. Plus we took if you look over here, we took a hit on assessed valuation this year. We took a hit on assessed valuation. As a result, we had less to work

with. I'm anticipating with the Transit Oriented Development, that two percent is going to translate into a lot of money with the assessed valuation going way up.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: Going down to the next line, to be raised, you're showing me twenty-six thousand dollars.

MAYOR McGINTY: Yes, listen to me. That is, right now, right now the property over by Pops is paying $X$ amount of taxes. The new number is $X$ plus two percent increase. That two percent increase is going to carry, as they do construction and build. So that two percent is going to be a very -- (audio cut out) You passed the Transit Oriented Development. You know that they're going to do something over there, don't you?

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: What if it doesn't happen in this budget?

MAYOR McGINTY: I can't address that. But $I$ can tell you, $I$ think Irene can bear this out, he's in financing right now for the project.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: You're just

5/3/21 Special Board Meeting showing us numbers of twenty-six thousand dollars. That future number is?

MAYOR McGINTY: I don't know what the assessed value is.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: You're telling me when the tax rate goes from thirty-five to thirty-six it's only bringing in twenty-six thousand dollars. That's what you're showing me on the screen

MAYOR McGINTY: That is because of the drastic laws of assessed value. Otherwise it would be higher.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: But that is fact. Assessed value went down, that's the number. Am I right?

MAYOR McGINTY: Yeah but this is not the full story.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: This is all I see. You just show us numbers.

MAYOR McGINTY: I don't know what to tell you. I'm trying to point out to you that because of the anticipated increase in assessed value, this two percent is going to mean a lot more than twenty-five thousand dollars and we

need to take advantage of it now so we can take advantage of it again in the future and going forward. If you are working, suppose you make a thousand dollars and you get it two percent raise. Let's use ten percent you're earning fifty thousand, ten percent that is fifty-five thousand. Your next increase is based on the fifty-five thousand. That is what I'm pointing out here. Next year's tax rate is based on the present tax rate. So there's an increase going forward, which is what we need. We tried to keep it reasonable.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I agree with Joe. We are going through this for this amount of money to increase the taxes.

MAYOR McGINTY: I'm not being funny. Do you understand if you earn fifty thousand, it becomes, ten percent becomes fifty-five thousand and that is what the new rate is based on as opposed to based on the fifty thousand.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: You know what, Michael, sorry to say this but these conversations should have happened a long time ago. It we did meet with you and you told us.

MAYOR McGINTY: It's a two-way street
Trustee.
TRUSTEE NAUDUS: A two-way street? We
kept asking about the beach. Who is being hired? What where we doing with the beach?

MAYOR McGINTY: I can't answer who is being hired? I don't know.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: To look at the salary schedule to say we need two managers three assistants managers twelve life guards and twenty parkers. Why do we need all that staff at the beach?

TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: I spoke to people that I needed. to be spoken to and it was all okay.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: Barbara, we're the people you need to speak to.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I spoke to people today, Barbara, and $I$ was told by the people that you are talking to they told you they wanted you to hire people back, not how many people you should hire for the beach.

TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: I need six and six. I have the whole schedule by the month

every single day. I took my time to do it.
MAYOR McGINTY: I just received this from Susan Boland. I'm okay. Just got here. He's in a lot of pain but okay. EMT thinks cracked ribs waiting to see the doc in the E.R. I thought that was important to interrupt.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Did you talk to who I was talking to today?

TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: I didn't speak to anyone today. It was Friday and I sent everything that had to be sent out. That is all I'm going to say.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Didn't we ask you to let us know to what you were doing before you started hiring people and asking people to come back?

TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: We left off finding out which kids are able to come back. Everyone knows the beach opens in June. Anybody wants to meet we can meet another time. This is a budget meeting, it's not a beach meeting.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: The beach is part of the budget.

TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: I only see zoning

that went up. I didn't see the beach that went up.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: Don't get
defensive.
TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: I'm always available to meet. This is not a good time to discuss the beach. That is the end of the story. That is all I'm going to say. Do you want to vote on the budget?

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Just with Barbara's
answer to the questions that we had, I'm not passing the budget. That is my opinion. If everyone on the phone wants to pass the budget say it now and I'm ending the conversation.

TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: We need to pass something.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: No, we don't have to pass the budget, we just live with the budget that we have and make changes going forward.

MAYOR McGINTY: Except for one thing. How do we handle if there are -- first of all, how do we handle the privatization problem and how do we handle the increase in tax?

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Michael, I don't

think that increase is taxes is going to kill us right now. I really don't.

MAYOR McGINTY: In years to come.
TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Next year we will
have another budget. This is ridiculous to hire all those people at the beach that Barbara doesn't want to talk about. Twenty parkers?

TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: Yes, I do need twenty. I have it all planned out.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Maybe if you sent that to us and educated us on why you need that many. It's like a secret.

MAYOR McGINTY: Trustee Naudus,
Trustee Volpe-Ried, would you agree to pass the budget with the proviso that we sit down and go through DPW and beach payroll?

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: No, I'm not passing
the budget Michael, I'm not.
TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: I'll show
everybody. I don't care, I'll show you the calendar I don't care.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Why do we need that staffing? Thirty-five thousand dollars a month for the beach staff for the beach at Island Park

seems excessive. If you would tell us why we need it I think we would all feel more comfortable.

Michael, it's not the beach that I'm concerned, it's the entire budget. There are too many holes, too many changes. I'm a hundred percent sure right now telling the Board that I will not agree to pass this budget. I don't know what Mike, Barbara and Joe feel. You need to speak your mind now because we are out here and talking about it.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: I think the way to go is read the resolution and take an individual vote and where it falls it falls.

TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: If you go to the budget from last year, that means everything that is budgeted last year is budgeted this year.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: No, we can change it. Like Michael, said we can make weekly changes, we can make two week changes, we can change it as a board. All we are going to do what Michael said passing the budget and changing things weekly or two weeks, we can do

that with the budget we have in place now.
MAYOR McGINTY: No, we can't.
TRUSTEE NAUDUS: Why? You said we can
before. You said we have the taxes.
MAYOR McGINTY: You asked me and I
tried to answer you. I repeat. We need the tax money. We need that increase going forward. It may not seem like anything now, but going forward that two percent is significant.

Second, we cannot increase expenses so privatization goes out the window.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: It's not increase I'm worried about, it's all the other stuff that I don't know is in there yet. I have questions.

MAYOR McGINTY: Joe, you were predisposed not to pass the budget.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: Nine budgets?
MAYOR McGINTY: I kept trying to make it better and better and trying to make a better bottom line that would be agreeable to all of us. That is the toughest budget I ever had to craft. You couldn't text me or call me and say let's meet?

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: You're supposed to reach out to the Board and say okay, these are the changes I'm making.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: As a group.
TRUSTEE NAUDUS: You confused the hell
out of us. Numbers changed so drastically and then you're saying oh, that was a mistake.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: What else is a mistake?

MAYOR McGINTY: There is no other mistakes.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: We don't know that. Madam Clerk, can I ask you a question?

MS. CONROY: Yes, Deputy Mayor.
TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: This resolution is written as adoption of tentative budget. What does that mean if we vote no or yes? Which budget is it and what do we do if it's a no.?

MS. CONROY: The resolution refers to the tentative budget that was prepared based on the Mayor's numbers that he e-mailed to me this morning. And I believe what I'm terming the eighth draft of the budget dated May 3rd.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: If it's not

MS. CONROY: As per Barbara Van Epp's e-mail from NYCOM, if it's not adopted this evening, the tentative budget automatically becomes the budget.

TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: Number eight automatically becomes the budget with the new tax rate and all that stuff.

TRUSTEE NAUDUS: No, I thought we would stay in the current budget, Connie.

MS. CONROY: As per her e-mail says if they do not adopt by that date, the tentative budget automatically becomes the adopted budget.

MAYOR McGINTY: If you adopt this budget, a one week look-ahead if that is what you want.
