3	Allegiance, the meeting was called to order.)
4	MAYOR McGINTY: So the meeting has
5	been called to order at six fifty-one p.m.
6	Public hearing to consider the document Local
7	Law 5 of the year 2022. The purpose of the
8	Local Law is to opt out of hosting prohibiting
9	the licensing establishment of retail cannabis
10	dispensaries within the Village of Island Park
11	pursuant to Cannabis Law Section 1315. Does the
12	Board have any comments or questions?
13	TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: No.
14	TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: No.
15	MAYOR McGINTY: Is there anybody from
16	the public, either on Zoom, because we don't
17	have anybody here at the Village hall? Seeing
18	none, just for the record, Ms. Boland, corporate
19	counsel, would you repeat what you sent us in
20	terms of the thirty day permissive period is
21	over.
22	MS. BOLAND: At the last Board meeting
23	in December you had the proposed local law which
24	is identical in looks, in writing to the local
25	law that you have before you today, but it was

2	subject to permissive referendum. What that
3	means is that the public would have had, the
4	residents would have had thirty days after that
5	meeting of that proposed local law, after that
6	proposed local law a notice was, public notice
7	was put out. They would have had thirty days to
8	file a petition and they would have had to say
9	that they wanted to have it put to referendum
10	and the residents would have had the opportunity
11	to vote on it. Because that was not done we can
12	go ahead and file it with the Secretary of State
13	and it will be effective immediately.

15	seek a motion and we will continue to work off a
16	roll call voting system, please. Motion by

- 9 Deputy Mayor Trustee Annarella.
- 10 TRUSTEE ANNARELLA: Present.
- MAYOR McGINTY: And Mayor McGinty
- 12 present. So we closed the hearing. We are done
- 13 with cannabis. Barbara, you can't open the
- 14 shop. Before we enter the public meeting,
- 15 Barbara, on Saturday, May 28th, that is going to
- 16 be our annual Memorial Day parade. As far as we
- 17 know, we have nobody set for the gazebo for that
- 18 day.

- 20 down already. It's for the fire department.
- 21 MAYOR McGINTY: I'm staring at Trustee
- 22 Annarella. It dawned on me the reason we use
- 23 that gazebo in the past the Gabelli Foundation
- 24 was there for their --

- 23 Nassau Police Department, specifically the 4th
- 24 Precinct, has, I believe, gone way out of their
- 25 way, above and beyond, to protect the residents

- 3 all deeply appreciative.
- 4 On another matter, would you tell
- 5 Lieutenant Solas I was asking for him. Thank
- 6 you, Sergeant. Are there any questions of
- 7 Sergeant Mamberger.
- 8 TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: No.
- 9 (Question from a resident in village
- 10 hall was unintelligible due to feedback.)
- 11 MAYOR McGINTY: I think I can address
- 12 that. Officer Salerno is well aware and through
- 13 his unit they have been trying to catch these
- 14 individuals. Our code enforcement officer, I
- 15 think it was two weeks ago, one o'clock in the
- 16 morning, he and I saw two guys and a gal going
- down Arlington Walk with a backpack and we had
- 18 reason to believe these were our culprits, so to
- 19 speak. We lost them down by where Radcliffe and
- 20 (inaudible) come together.
- I reminded Code Endorsement Officer
- 22 Sparacchio these were the people that we found
- 23 at Lexington two summers ago at two-thirty in
- 24 the morning. We notified Officer Salerno of our
- 25 findings. You may want to check with him. He

- 3 matter. Thank you.
- 4 You will find historically that over
- 5 the past eight years, sector cars during the
- 6 week have doubled. On the weekend you can find
- 7 three sector cars out of Island Park on a
- 8 regular basis. In addition, the number of
- 9 unmarked police cars patrolling through Island
- 10 Park have increased exponentially. The crime
- 11 statistics, if you FOIL the crime statistics
- 12 from the Village of Island Park monthly meetings
- 13 you will see that the crime statistics bear out
- 14 in the presence of the 4th Precinct in the
- 15 Village.

- 17 to Oceanside.

- 19 Don't forget Lieutenant Solas, please.
- 20 Resolution Number 5, Public Safety

- 3 published in the official newspaper of the

- 8 thereon and also a notice that said will be sold
- 9 on February 15th -- hold it. When they say real
- 10 estate they mean taxes. Nobody is selling real
- 11 estate -- will be sold February 15, 2022 public
- 12 auction, Village Hall, 127 Long Beach Road,
- 13 Island Park to discharge tax, fees, interest and
- 14 charges aforesaid which may be due thereon, at
- 15 the time of the sale.
- Be it further resolved on the date of
- 17 sale specified in such notice Village Treasurer
- 18 or Village Clerk shall commence the sale of real
- 19 estate and continue the same from day-to-day to
- 20 fulfill each parcel shall be sold as will be
- 21 sufficient to pay tax, fees, interest, charges
- 22 will be due.
