

13	successful with the City of Long
14	Beach, the fire department in the
15	City of Long Beach as well as the
16	police department in the City of Long
17	Beach and the fire department in
18	Point Lookout. So we are hoping to
19	use his expertise here. And
20	Mr. Weitz will be working with the
21	grant guys that we used in the past.
22	However, the grant guys and the
23	leadership in the department, we need
24	some expedited recordkeeping and
25	Weitz will provide that as well as

6	a year ago, you said Lesley Warwild
7	was doing the grant writing for us
8	(phonetic).

10	grant writing with me on the federal.
11	Right now, we are working on the
12	grant for the second phase. You
13	know, we have the \$40 million for
14	first phase, that includes the
15	construction occurring by the school,
16	that's the next phase of the
17	construction. We are now pursuing
18	another phase for additional funds
19	that include well, the rest of
20	Island Park up by you, some road
21	reconstruction, new drains, drain
22	boxes as well as a storm drain pump
23	station, and that's in the second
24	phase.
25	TRUSTEE NATIOUS. So do vou have

6	Debt Service to \$2,036,027.00.
7	Contingency \$323,027.00.

11	\$750,000.00.
12	
13	Total Budget revised:
14	\$7,593,440.00.

16	MAYOR McGINTY: Ultimately,
17	this is a result of when we pay down
18	the 750 and renew the bond, we
19	transfer money from a capital account
20	to what is known as the "budget,"
21	account, that is the account that all
22	the money flows through first into
23	the operating account. That \$750,000
24	as a transfer in a municipal county
25	becomes a revenue item. The

2	contingency was left out of the
3	budget in error. I made two typos,
4	one on debt service, one on
5	contingency, and this clarifies both.
6	TRUSTEE NAUDUS: I thought we
7	were going to have meetings about the
8	budget.
9	MAYOR McGINTY: These are just
10	they are not budget meetings and
11	they are not budget items. The first
12	two are typo situations and
13	misclassifications. I should have
14	had the 323 broken out of debt
15	service with contingency. That 750
16	is just indicative of being
17	transferred from capital to general.
18	It doesn't change. It doesn't
19	substantively change the budget. We
20	are not adding expenses. We are not
21	reducing or increasing expenditures.
22	We are not increasing or reducing
23	revenue, it's just a
24	reclassification.
25	TRUSTEE NAMBUS. So you are

8	Department, New Fire Truck.
9	Whereas, the Incorporated
10	Village of Island Park Board of
11	Trustees ("the board") has determined
12	that the Island Park Fire Department
13	is in need of a new fire truck; and
14	whereas, the board has reviewed bids
15	for the purchase of a fire truck.
16	Therefore, be it resolved that the
17	mayor is authorized to purchase a
18	fire truck for the Island Park Fire
19	Department for \$700,000.00.
20	MAYOR McGINTY: Before I ask
21	for a motion, I would like to put the
22	following on the record. The most
23	important part is that the present
24	vehicle, the present fire truck,
25	LaFrance, has had I asked former

2	Trustee Gagliardi to sit with our
3	staff, Nicole Savone, and they
4	determined that in the last three
5	years, there were an average
6	maintenance and repairs of,
7	approximately, \$17,000, \$18,000.
8	Second, the LaFrance is no longer in
9	business. So parts are virtually
10	impossible to get. And third, and
11	most vital, the truck is more than 20
12	years old. It's time. And now the
13	fourth point, in the month of June,
14	we make our final payment on one of
15	the fire trucks, so we will be able
16	to afford this truck.
17	And now in terms of this truck,
18	Deputy Mayor or Trustee Tice, correct
19	me if I'm wrong, the truck has 3,000
20	miles on it, which translates into
21	120 hours on the engine.
22	TRUSTEE GRACI: Correct.
23	MAYOR McGINTY: The truck, the
24	initial cost is about let me just
25	be sure the initial cost on the

2	truck is, give or take, an estimated
3	\$650,000. We will end up taking the
4	apparatus, the hose apparatus from
5	what LaFrance, the deck, the deck
6	setup from the LaFrance and
7	installing it on this truck that we
8	have just purchased.
9	TRUSTEE GRACI: Yes.
10	MAYOR McGINTY: There are odds
11	and ends, including gauges that need
12	to be installed. On the doors, we
13	need reflectors and lights on it so
14	the men and women coming out of the
15	truck during a fire, everybody can
16	see it. In addition, the power train
17	and transmission and the engine on
18	all three trucks now is virtually the
19	same, meaning that we are able to
20	inventory items and then better
21	maintain our inventory equipment.
22	Coming back to the new truck.
23	Front to back, two-year warranty.
24	Two-year warranty on the power train,
25	including the transmission.

2	TRUSTEE GRACI: Ten-year paint,
3	lifetime lights, that's about it. It
4	you don't mind?
5	MAYOR McGINTY: I don't mind at
6	all.
7	TRUSTEE GRACI: In other words,
8	they take this truck to different
9	areas to show them what they can get
10	and you can buy this truck. If you
11	want to purchase a new truck in the
12	time right now, you are probably
13	looking at a year to two and you are
14	probably looking at close to a
15	million dollars, so that's why we
16	grant this.
17	MAYOR McGINTY: Well, my
18	concern is that I didn't want to hang
19	on to that LaFrance any longer.
20	TRUSTEE GRACI: Yeah. That
21	truck died in a fire with people
22	inside and they lost water.
23	MAYOR McGINTY: I just can't
24	take that kind of chance, I don't
25	want to. So a motion to go forward.

11	capital funding provided to NY State
12	Governor's Office of Storm Recovery
13	(GOSR)
14	MAYOR McGINTY: Before I ask
15	for a motion, this deals with the
16	resiliency project at the firehouse.
17	It includes a new bed, it includes
18	rebuilding the entire emergency
19	management center, which is our
20	second floor. It includes the
21	installation of an elevator. The
22	elevator, an important point of the
23	elevator, call it \$50,000. It was ar
24	additional cost of about \$50,000. It
25	was moved unbeknownst to the Mayor

2	and the Board, unbeknownst to the
3	fire department and the chiefs,
4	whoever took their eyes off the ball,
5	it doesn't matter, but the relocation
6	back to its original spot and the
7	electrical work that had to be done
8	cost an overage that we are going to
9	be responsible for. We are also
10	responsible for floor tiles and roof
11	tiles. And I believe, did you tell
12	me that the men were going to install
13	some of the stuff themselves?

7	with National Grid, which I found out
8	about three months into it, and I was
9	able to assist in getting it done. ]
10	didn't know about the problem. We
11	had an American water problem or a
12	Liberty water problem, which was
13	rectified within 10 days. Bill
14	Brennen from H2M has been johnny on
15	the spot. He is there six days a
16	week managing and making sure the
17	water is being done properly. We had
18	some changes to the hood. We had
19	some changes to the hood in the
20	kitchen. The fire alarm system had
21	to be changed, according to the
22	Nassau County Fire Marshal, the
23	sprinkler system in particular. What
24	am I leaving out?
25	TRUSTEE TICE: I didn't get

3	MAYOR McGINTY: I mean, odds
4	and ends.

10	Wasn't it all supposed to be
11	included? What happened?

18	still in code enforcement and a New

21	paint it. Otherwise, he was just
22	going to paint that and leave.
23	TRUSTEE VOLPE-RIED: I wasn't
24	just saying paint. It seemed like
25	everything from the start, and it was

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2	someone overseeing it. Now, sort of
3	Bobby said that they were told there
4	is nothing they can do.
5	MAYOR McGINTY: We made a
6	couple of changes. H2M, in
7	conjunction with the state, provided
8	this much, 20 percent of the
9	construction management that they are
10	providing now. After consultation
11	with the state people, it was
12	determined that Bill Brennen had to
13	be on-site as the construction
14	manager full time, so he is there all
15	the time. That's part of this
16	override on this over-budget, but
17	that's what it came to. We had to
18	fight with the state to get a
19	full-time construction manager on the
20	job. The state was trying to save
21	nickels and dimes. They went
22	through. The state started off at
23	\$900,000. And by the time, last week
24	by the time they got to it, they were
25	at 1.65 million with all of the

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2	happenings.
3	TRUSTEE TICE: And there is
4	still a lot of shortcomings with that
5	project.
6	MAYOR McGINTY: I can't argue
7	with that. Let me get you crazy.
8	It's not like they walked in the door
9	and started from scratch. They had
10	the set of plans of the original
11	firehouse that Michael got a hold of.
12	TRUSTEE TICE: I gave it to
13	them. I gave it to them.
14	MAYOR McGINTY: Gagliardi
15	requested them.
16	TRUSTEE TICE: Right.
17	MAYOR McGINTY: And didn't you
18	also give them the 1976 plans?
19	TRUSTEE TICE: That's correct.
20	MAYOR McGINTY: So I mean, but
21	here is a case where everything that
22	could go wrong did.
