"Do you have reports that outline how this affects home values in the immediate vicinity of the substation?"

And their answer is, "We're new at this."

I asked them specific questions, "What happens with the underground cables? Does that affect land value? Does that affect people wanting to move into the community?"

"We're from Norway. We're new at this."
